## The basics.

When first using your Chameleon Pens<sup>™</sup>, the Super Soft Brush Nib might seen slightly hard and appear pointed (Fig. 1a) but in use, it will quickly softe Once this natural "breaking in process" is complete, the fibers at the end of the nib will loosen and splay a little. (Fig. 1b) This is normal and allows it to perform more like a paintbrush.

Important: The Brush Nib is delicate – so for extended nib life be light-handed when coloring. In the event you damage either nib don't worry, they're inexpensive and easy to replace.

Nibs: Your Chameleon Pens<sup>™</sup> are double-ended with a Japanese Bullet Nib at one end and a Super Soft Brush Nib at the other - both can be infused and are easily replaceable.

**Bullet Nib** - (Fig. 1c) Firm nib, great for outlining, drawing and working in small areas with precision coloring. (Fig. 1c) The Bullet Nib is very durable.

Super Soft Brush Nib - (Fig. 1d)
The Brush Nib has a 'paintbrush'
feel. Its soft fibrous structure
allows ink to flow beautifully
across paper for bigger
color gradations. The Brush Nib
is super soft - so for longer life, be
light-handed.

All the nibs in the Chameleon System are replaceable! (Fig. 1e) Chameleon Pens contain permanent alcohol inks and both the pens and the mixing chamber are completely refillable (Fig. 1f)To see how simple step-by-step videos on how to replace nibs and

- Color in a side-to-side motion, slightly overlapping the previous line, all the way to the edges of the image, working from light to dark for a seamless blend. (Fig. 3d)

**IMPORTANT:** The Mixing Chamber should always be on top of the pen when fusing. Never leave the pen engaged in the Mixing Chamber, always put caps back on before storing.

  - Color in a side-to-side motion, slightly overlapping the previous line, all the way to the edges of the image, working from light to dark for a seamless blend. (Fig. 4d)

**IMPORTANT:** The Color Top should always be on top of the pen when fusing. Never leave the pen engaged in the Mixing Chamber, always put caps back on before storing.
